

Case Study 01

Raj Kumar Paul (ID 032092) used to be a gas balloon seller. In 2020, at a local fair, his gas balloon machine had suddenly burst leaving him severely injured. Both his legs had to be amputated from above the knees. The impact of the accident was devastating-breaking him mentally, physically and financially. He and his wife fell into extreme poverty. His friends and neighbours collected money to feed him and family. One of his friends, who was also an amputee and prosthesis recipient, brought him to MSS in January 2022. On 9th January, 2022, Rotary Global Grant helped him get prosthesis for both his legs-giving him new hope. He was given basic prosthesis to help him adjust to them. After six months he would receive full length prosthesis with knee joints. Going ahead, the project also aims to reintegrate Raj Kumar to the community by giving him livelihood support.



Case Study 02

Raja Ghosh (ID 030750), is a 6 year old boy who lost his leg in a road accident when he was just 2.5 years. A speeding truck had run him over severing his left leg.

The Global Grant project helped him receive his third prosthesis at Mahavir Seva Sadan. Since he is in a growing age, his prosthesis requires replacement frequently to match his limb circumference.

Raja will join school this year and is looking forward to it. He wants to go to a hotel management college when he grows up and become a chef!



Case Study 03

Shiuli Rani Manna (ID 023227) had married quite young to the man she loved dreaming of a beautiful life. Only 5 months after her marriage, while helping her mother-inlaw run a commercial spice grinding machine for their home based business, her right leg got stuck in the machine.

The amputation had shattered her dreams, leaving her feeling incomplete and depressed. Her husband and parents-in-laws were very caring and motivated her to restart her life.

At 23 now, she has gone back to high school to complete her studies. The Global Grant supported her prosthesis fitment, enabling her to continue with her dreams of graduating and enrolling for a teachers' training course.

She also has a small son and she takes care of him without feeling inadequate or incomplete.
