Scenario 3

You are approached by a Club President who has advised you that his club will be closing at the end of the Rotary year. They have 18 members, all aged over 80, but no one wishes to take on the role of President – yet again. Most, however, would like to remain within Rotary. What suggestions and ideas would you discuss with this Club President, and would you include all the club members in your discussions?

Key points

- Discuss the geography of the club itself.
- Is there another club nearby
- Satellite Club, keep the legacy of their club in the area.
- District passport club/E club.
- Keep hold of club charter for re distribution to other new clubs
- Share Board responsibilities with a neighbouring club. (Could be temporary)
- Liaise with Coordinator team

Scenario 4

It has come to your attention that many Rotarians have very little knowledge about Rotary outside of their own club and have very few connections outside the club. The Rotaractors feel isolated from Rotarians. Also, the professional Rotarians are in the minority in many clubs. You know that meeting Rotarians outside your club is very inspiring and motivational to be a more engaged Rotarian. You need to come up with new and creative ideas to connect Rotarians and Rotaractors from different clubs in the district. You fear that if you do not, the younger Rotarians will leave Rotary, and Rotaractors will not continue into Rotary. You have also considered bringing attention to one of the seven areas of focus. To bring this all together you have decided to hold an event.

Key Points

- How can you connect Rotarians, Rotaractors, and their family members, from different clubs in the district?
- Who will you work together with? (Membership Public image coordinator team Foundation chair)
- How do you bring attention to one of the seven areas of focus at this event?
- What can you do in your district? And how will you spread the word before, during, and after so as everyone has access to the event
- How can we attract those from outside of the organisation to the event?
